(The Federation of St Alphege Church of England Infant and Nursery School and St Alphege Church of England Junior School) Order 2014

MADE 10th DECEMBER 2014

In exercise of the powers conferred on Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council by the provisions of the School Governance (Constitution)(England) Regulations 2012 and the School Governance (Federations)(England) Regulations 2012, Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council being the local authority for the Metropolitan Borough of Solihull, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Instrument of Government (The Federation of St Alphege Church of England Infant and Nursery School and St Alphege Church of England Junior School) Order 2014.
2. The Instrument of Government The Federation of St Alphege Church of England Infant and Nursery School and St Alphege Church of England Junior School shall be that set out in the Schedule hereto and shall when it comes into force replace any earlier Instrument of Government.

1. The name of the federation is: The Federation of St Alphege Church of England Infant and Nursery School and St Alphege Church of England Junior School
2. The names and categories of the schools in the federation are:

5. Total number of governors (including any sponsor governors and additional foundation governors appointed in accordance with regulation 25(2) or 27(2) of the Federation Regulations): 19

6. Foundation governors are appointed as follows:
 - a. Two governors are appointed or may be removed by the Diocesan Board of Education
 - b. One governor is appointed and may be removed by the Governors of Solihull School.
 - c. Seven governors are appointed and may be removed by the Parochial Church Council of the ecclesiastical parish of Solihull.

7. The holder of the following office shall be an ex-officio foundation governor:

The Rector of the ecclesiastical parish of Solihull

The Bishop of Birmingham shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (7) above, in the event that the ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has failed to attend meetings of the governing body for a continuous period of twelve months beginning with the date of a meeting, or is disqualified from acting as a governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 23 (c) of the Regulations or there is a vacancy of more than twelve months in the office by virtue of which his governorship exists.

8. Deriving from its historic foundation and from the Solihull United Charities Scheme dated 28th October 1965 Sections 42-45, whereby the Schools are the Primary School of the Foundation of Solihull School, the Schools will preserve and develop their religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.
9. The Schools aim to serve their community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. They encourage an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promote Christian values through the experience offered to all pupils.
10. This instrument comes into effect on 1st January 2015.
11. This instrument was made by order of Solihull Local Authority on 10th December 2014
12. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
