Weekly Reading & Phonics Tasks

Day 1

Phonics

Access the Espresso site. [Click here](#) to log on.

Click on the Key Stage 1 tab at the top and find the English, Phonics section. Enter the Scully's phonics, Phase 5 alternative pronunciations.

Watch the video for **y** (i, igh, ee). Today we'll be focusing on **y** making the 'igh' sound as in 'fly'.

Share the following words with your child: *fry, sky, my, why, try, by, fly, sly, deny, reply, supply.*

Play a game of phonics bingo – play together and each create a bingo grid using six of the **y** words from above. Ask a family member to call out words and the first to cross all of their words out, wins!

Reading

Open your **2do in Purple Mash** and read the second chapter of the book **Ned and the Jungle Creatures**. You could take it in turns with an adult to read a paragraph each.

Then open your **2do Chapter 2 Quiz** and complete.

Day 2

Phonics

Access the Espresso site (details above).

Click on the Key Stage 1 tab at the top and find the English, Phonics section. Enter the Scully's phonics, Phase 5 alternative pronunciations.

Revisit the video for **y** (i, igh, ee). Today we'll be focusing on **y** making the 'ee' sound as in 'happy'.

Share the following words with your child: *funny, lolly, crunchy, happy, carry, baby, berry, twenty, family.*

Write the above **y** words on a piece of paper and draw a picture to represent each word.

Reading

Open your **2do in Purple Mash** and read the second chapter of the book **Ned and the Jungle Creatures** again. You could take it in turns with an adult to read a paragraph each.

Then open your **2do Chapter 2 Missing Words** and complete.

Day 3

Phonics

Access the Espresso site (details above).

Click on the Key Stage 1 tab at the top and find the English, Phonics section. Enter the Scully's phonics, Phase 5 alternative pronunciations.

Revisit the video for **y** (i, igh, ee). Today we'll be focusing on **y** making the 'i' sound as in 'gym'.

Share the following words with your child: *hymn, cygnet, crystal, pyramid, gym, cymbals, syrup, mystery* and ask your child to sound each word out and then have a go at writing them down.

You could also complete the two activities on Espresso if you would like, sorting and reading words with the different ways to pronounce **y**.

Reading

Open your **2do in Purple Mash** and read the second chapter of the book **Ned and the Jungle Creatures**. You could take it in turns with an adult to read a paragraph each.

Then open your **2do Chapter 2 Joining Words** and complete. When you are reading other books see if you can find some joining words in those stories.

Weekly Writing Tasks

Weekly Maths Tasks – Mass

This week use the Oak National Academy online video lessons and follow up worksheets/activities. You are always welcome to upload any completed work to your work folder on Purple Mash.

Lego maze


Using a lego base board and bricks, can you create a maze/track which a ping pong ball or marble could travel down in exactly 5 seconds?

Pom pom launcher

Great fun for a sneaky attack!

Materials:-

2 x empty toilet rolls

Pencil

Scissors

2 x rubber bands

Tape

Pom poms

Instructions:-

1. With one roll, fold it in half the long way, and then in half again the long way.
2. Carefully pierce the pencil near the top of your folded roll. Put the roll half way on to the pencil.
3. On your unfolded roll, cut two parallel lines, about a centimetre deep and centimetre apart. Repeat on the opposite side of the same edge. Now you should have two tabs.
4. Place your rubber bands on the tabs and tape them in.
5. Put the pencil into the rubber band hole. The rubber bands should be on top and the pencils on the bottom.
6. Stretch the bands over the pencil.
7. Put the pom pom in the top, pull the pencil back and launch it!
